1. BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMME

The Erasmus Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) is a new short-term intensive mobility option envisaged by the new Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme. Using innovative teaching and learning approaches, it offers an international experience that combines short-term physical mobility with a mandatory virtual component.

Description	Our summer school focuses on Transmediality in pan-Hispanic artistic products. In recent decades, a significant transformation in the perception and interpretation of reality has unfolded, producing continuous changes in artistic languages and technics, such as transmedial, transtextual, and transcultural dynamisms activated with the progressive dissolution of borders between languages, nations, and genres. This phenomenon has been particularly intense in the pan-Hispanic context, both in Spain and Hispano-America. The objective is to explore different forms of hybridization and integration in literary and artistic works, as manifestation of cultural changes. In this sense, we understand transmediality not only in the restrictive sense of simultaneous creation across multiple media (Jenkins, 2010: 945), but also in a broader sense, including the reuse, adaptation and hybridization of media, arts, genres, subjects and cultures. The prefixes trans- and inter- (Rajewsky, 2018) coincide in identifying intersections of codes, media, cultures, and knowledge. However, in an academic context, the use of inter- refers to an attitude that recognizes the diversity and specificity of autonomous systems to highlight their intersections (cf. Higgins, 1984; Sánchez-Mesa and Baetens, 2017; Pérez Latorre, 2012), while trans- implies transcending borders in favor of convergence and hybridization (cf. Jenkins, 2006; Scolari, 2013; Vilches, 2013; Sánchez-Mesa y Baetens, 2017). Whereas the first establishes a juxtaposition of areas that share some elements, the latter proposes a fusion of concomitant systems.
	The summer school will provide an opportunity for transferring knowledge, widening critical and aesthetic awareness, and fostering interaction and teamwork in an inclusive, international, and innovative education context. This aligns with the idea of an "open university" as a way to form more conscious European citizen. Students' involvement will be strengthened by their active participation, discussing the content in two ways: they can propose presentations on specific case studies, applying the methodologies explained in the online meetings, and they must participate in one of the proposed workshops.

3. WHO CAN APPLY

Application requirements are listed below:

 Being regularly enrolled at the University of Milan for the 2023/2024 academic year, on the Master in European and Extra-european Languages and Literatures (LM-37) or on the Master in Languages and Cultures for Communication and International Cooperation (LM-38)

or

Being regularly enrolled on Linguistic, Literary and Intercultural Studies in European and ExtraEuropean Perspectives



- 2. Minimum ECTS: 180
- 3. Minimum level B2 of Spanish, certifiable with at least three Spanish Language exams already taken during the university career (between the Bachelor's and Master's degrees) and, for students enrolled in the Master in European and Extra-European Languages and in the Master in Literatures or in Languages and Cultures for Communication and International Cooperation, the presence of at least one exam in Spanish Literature or Culture, Hispanic American Literatures or Cultures in the Master's degree programme.
- 4. Being current with tuition and fee payments
- 5. Not being a recipient of any other EU grant for stays abroad that overlap, even partially, with the BIP Erasmus+ period

4. APPLICATION

The following documentation is required:

- 1) A motivation letter explaining the reasons for the application in relation to the BIP's learning objectives (to be entered in the appropriate field of the online application form);
- 2) Signed CV and copy of ID (PDF file; max 5 MB);
- 3) **Signed** self-certified transcript of records (PDF file; max 5 MB);

5. SELECTION PROCESS

A Rector-appointed board will select up to 3 students/phd students on the following criteria:

- a) Academic career and CV (up to 15 points):
- b) Language skills (up to 5 points);
- c) Candidate's motivation (up to 10 points).

No interviews will be conducted.

The selection outcome will be posted to https://www.unimi.it/en/international/study-abroad/international-opportunities by May 7, 2024.

6. SCHOLARSHIPS

Selected students will be granted an individual BIP mobility grant of €70 per day. Students with fewer opportunities may receive an additional contribution of €100/day (for a 5-14-day period of physical mobility).



All admitted students who will complete the physical and virtual mobility programme will be eligible to these grants.
