Tarquinia Summer School 2021-2022 Call for Applications

THE RECTOR

- Pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 162 dated 10 March 1982, namely articles 1 (paragraph 2, subpart c), 16 and 17, concerning postgraduate advanced courses;
- Pursuant to art. 6 of Law no. 341 dated 19 November 1990;
- Pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 270 of 22 October 2004, providing new rules governing the educational autonomy of Universities and supplanting Ministerial Decree no. 509 of 3 November 1999;
- Pursuant to the Statute of the University of Milan, issued by Rector's decree on 15 March 2012, as amended and supplemented;
- Pursuant to the Academic Regulations of the University of Milan, issued by Rector's Decree no. 1208 of 4 March 2020;
- Pursuant to the Regulations for Master's programmes, advanced courses and lifelong learning, issued by Rector's Decree no. 1737 of 23 April 2020;
- Pursuant to the resolutions adopted by the Academic Senate, in its meeting of 15 March 2022, and by the Board of Directors, in its meeting of 29 March 2022, approving the Tarquinia Summer School programme for the 2021/2022 academic year;

HEREBY DECREES AS FOLLOWS:

The Tarquinia Summer School will run for the 2021/2022 academic year starting in September. The programme coordinator is Prof. Giovanna Bagnasco, full professor of Etruscology and Italic antiquities (subject area: L-ANT/06). The programme will be taught by professors from this and other universities as well as external experts.

Learning objectives

The Summer School aims to provide students with notions of archaeology through a series of educational and field activities in Tarquinia, one of the most important Etruscan sites on the



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Italian Peninsula. Participants will hone the skills needed for excavation, site documentation and materials study. They will also tackle the dissemination and enhancement of archaeological heritage through case studies, as well as educational insights and guided tours. The Summer School contributes to the training of students in archaeology by giving them an opportunity to follow all steps of the archaeological process, from excavation to evidence treatment, including documentation, survey, materials study as well as instructions for restoration, enhancement/planning, use, communication.

Academic organisation

The course will be held from 7 to 22 September 2022 in Tarquinia (VT), with 75 hours' teaching and exercises in English structured as follows:

- Archaeological excavation: the students, divided into small groups led by a supervisor, will take part in the excavations of the University of Milan at the monumental complex of the Civita di Tarquinia;
- Study of archaeological materials: the students, divided into small groups led by a supervisor, will be introduced to the study of archaeological materials and will have the opportunity to analyse and catalogue the finds from the digs of the University of Milan at the monumental complex of the Civita di Tarquinia;
- Insights and guided tours: the students will also learn through Etruscology insights and guided visits to the main sites and museums in Tarquinia and its surroundings.

A total of 3 academic credits (CFU) will be awarded for all training activities.

Attendance in the various course activities of the programme is mandatory.

Admission requirements

The programme is aimed at students of Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in one of the following classes pursuant to Ministerial Decree 270/2004: L-1 Cultural heritage and LM-2 Archaeology. Bachelor's and Master's students in other subjects may also be admitted to the programme, subject to assessment by the competent boards.



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Applications by candidates who studied abroad will be assessed by the admission board, in compliance with the regulations in force in Italy and in the country where the candidate completed their studies.

Selection process

The maximum number of places available is set at 20; the programme will not be run if the number of participants is less than 10. Participants will be selected based on the assessment of their CV.

Enrolment fee

Those admitted to the course shall pay an enrolment fee of \in **1,616.00** (including insurance coverage and a \in 16.00 stamp duty), by the enrolment date.

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Enrolment

Those admitted to the course are required to enrol, under penalty of forfeiture, within 7 working days of the notice of admission.

You can enrol as follows:

- 1. Register on the University portal at <u>https://registrazione.unimi.it/</u>. This operation is not required of applicants already registered on the portal or with University login credentials, such as Milan University students or graduates, who can go to the next step;
- 2. Payment the €1,116.00 enrolment fee by bank transfer;
- 3. Send your payment receipt and a copy of your ID to the Student Office for PHD, Masters, State Exams and Post-Graduate Programmes, through <u>InformaStudenti</u> (select the POSTGRADUATE>Advanced courses option from the menu).

Payment details will be notified to the email address provided during the admission process.

Withdrawal

Withdrawal must be notified to the Student Office for PHD, Masters, State Exams and Post-Graduate Programmes through <u>InformaStudenti</u> (select the POSTGRADUATE>Advanced courses option from the menu).

If withdrawal occurs prior to the actual start of the course, any fees paid will be reimbursed, less a 10% charge - not lower than € 100.00 - covering general and administrative costs.

Certificate of attendance

At the end of the course, a certificate of attendance will be issued to students who fulfilled their obligations.
